TEACHER TRAINING ON PHONETICS

Teachers at Sri Aurobindo Public School receive high-quality trainings to equip them with knowledge that supports their own learning and exploration. On 28 March, a training was held on 'Phonetics' in Aurobindo Hall from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., for all language teachers and elementary teachers of the school. The resource person, Dr. Seema Singh, has worked for more than 24 years in CBSE schools and international educational organizations. She has a track record of successfully



mentoring and overseeing educators. Dr. Seema described the NATO phonetics alphabet. She also emphasized the importance of word pronunciation since pupils pick up word pronunciation from their teachers in class. The teacher proposed numerous initiatives to teach English language to children in grades KG to X. She helped the teachers realize that different sentences require different levels of emphasis and intonation. She also discussed the cutting-edge approaches to teaching poetry, prose, and even writing assignments, using examples from courses 3, 5 and 10. She also provided a list of terms that over 80% of Indians frequently pronounce incorrectly.

The teachers gained from the engaging and energy-filling nature of the program. Every educator will apply the knowledge in their classrooms as well. The Principal presented a vote of thanks and the Director, Retd Col K J S Randhawa presented a token of gratitude to the resource person.
