Sir, we salute you on your great achievement



Mr. S.P. Oswal was born in 1942. He holds a Masters Degree in Commerce with Gold Medal from Punjab University, Chandigarh. The phenomenal growth Vardhman Group has achieved in the last four decades has been possible solely because of his charismatic leadership. The Group employs about 23,000 people and its presence is felt throughout India. Vardhman Group today has the largest yarn manufacturing capacity in the country with over 8,00,000 spindles. It also has one of the largest fabric weaving plants and also has one of the most modern state of the art fabric processing facility in the country. Apart from this he had even set examples for others and hence has helped in rapid industrialisation during the post liberalization period.

One of the social achievement of his career is the first village cluster adoption programme. Mr. S.P. Oswal's initiative to improve the yield of cotton in Punjab in 2001 when the State had suffered a crop devastation and the area under cotton cultivation was dwindling, he adopted villages to see whether concerted efforts in bringing knowledge to farmers could improve the yield of cotton. The experiment was successful as it improved the yield of cotton in the State of Punjab.

Mr Oswal believes in the power of youth. He believes if the youth equipped to be self-reliant could build up a career on merit. Training programmes for the youth of socially under privileged students are being run for the last three years. As a result, nearly 140 students have got employment, Fourth such a programme is being run currently.

Mr Oswal believes that every corporate house has a social responsibility. This commitment towards the society has resulted in setting up of educational and research institutions in Ludhiana, Baddi and a new school is proposed at Budni in Madhya Pradesh. He believes education is incomplete if assessment of a student is limited only to the marks obtained. Drawing the philosophy of Sri Aurobindo, he initiated practices for the introduction of holistic development of human beings. This principle is religiously followed at Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce and Management in Ludhiana and in Sri Aurobindo Public School, Baddi.

We are grateful to the visionary who has made us scale new heights in the field of education and enabled us to build leading institutions in Baddi & Ludhiana. We stand united in our commitment to his ideals and reiterate our dedication to his vision.



Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation

A very famous Chinese proverb says "Learning is a treasure that follows its owner every where." To acquire such education a child has to experience each and everything that he learns. If he does not learn through experiences, but just read books he may not be able to retain that for long. The larger context of education is to prepare futuristic citizens for a meaningful and productive life in a globalised society. There is a dire need to strengthen the education system even more so in a pluralistic society while addressing a heterogeneous group. Understanding the necessity of such a change in the field of education CBSE has introduced a new system of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation.

The CCE scheme aims at evaluating a child in a holistic manner. The proposed Certificate of School Based Assessment for Classes 9th and 10th is divided into three parts. Part 1 consists of Scholastic areas. The academic performance of the learner in the classes 9th and 10th will be reflected in the form of grades. Two terms have been suggested during a year, term 1 from April to September and term 2 from October to March for classes 9th as well as 10th. Each term will carry two formative and one summative assessment. The grading scale for scholastic domain is a nine point scale based on direct grading. Part 2 comprises of co-scholastic areas which includes Life-Skills and attitudes and values. A five point grading scale for assessment in Life-Skills and a three point scale for assessment in attitudes and values has been proposed. Part 3 consists of co-scholastic activities which include participation in Literary, Scientific, Aesthetic and Club activities. Second sub-section under this head includes Health and Physical Education. It has been proposed to assess the students on a three point scale in all these areas.


SAPS - Gearing up for the change

SAPS has always been in the forefront as far as change is concerned. The Proposal of CCE introduced by CBSE is an extended vision of Sri Aurobindo and Mother who had already propounded holistic education around 6 decades before. We have been following a system which is activity based and helps a child to bring out his inherent talents. The teachers have been trained for dealing with the changes and they have been equipped to face the new challenges in the field of education. From the current session we are extending this to language education with the introduction of Supplementary reading material in English language. As per the guidelines of CBSE various visits to Heritage sites and Club activities will commence from April 1. We have been organizing various competitions with a view to shape the overall personality of our students and credit lies in the fact that participation has always been hundred percent.

No child in the School is labelled as dull or incapable, as we realize that every child is a gift of nature abundantly packed with talents. Our mission is to instill in them the values of being a responsible citizen, a good student and bringing inherent qualitative change in him. " Character may be manifested in the great moments, but it is made in the smaller ones."




